



Be a Peace of the Puzzle: Peace Problems

Part of being a piece of the peace puzzle in your community is finding problems that are preventing peace, and solving those problems in a creative way!

1	The following prompt will help you think about ways to peacefully fix problems you see in your community!							
1.	With your class, a group, or by yourself, think of problems that you see in the world, or things you think the world needs. These can be problems or needs that you face in your everyday life, or it can be problems or needs that you see in the world around you. Make a list of these problems or needs below:							
2.	Look at your list above and pick one of the problems or needs. Now think about this problem. Is it a big problem? Or a small problem?							
3.	Who does this problem affect? Who does it hurt?							



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4.	. Have other people tried to stop this problem? If so, what did they try to do to stop it?							

5. Now, think of a way to solve that problem peacefully! How do you think you could solve that problem? Remember, the way you fix the problem must be non-violent and peaceful!

6. How will your solution to the problem affect the people in your community? How will it make their lives better?



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Now it's time to turn your ideas into a story!

Keep in mind that this story can be fiction - it can be made up. When writing you can make up an exciting story about how you solved the problem in your community and how it was wildly successful!

	The following questions will help guide you in your story-writing process! Keep in mind, your story can be true, or it can be made up!
1.	In your story, what made your main character (this character can be you, or a made up character) realize there was a problem in his/her community? Was it something he/she experienced? Was it something he/she saw on the news? Was it something their friends told them about?
2.	How did your main character come up with the idea for their non-violent solution to the problem? Did they work with others or by themselves?
3.	Did his/her way of fixing the problem work on the first try, or did it take several tries to fix?
4.	How did your main character's solution change their life and/or the lives of people around them? How did people's lives get better?

Now that you've thought about your answers to all of these questions, use the back of this paper, or a separate paper, to write the whole story!



Be a Peace of the Puzzle: Peems for Peace

A big part of creating a community that builds and encourages peace is realizing that each and every person is unique and special in their own way, and that each and every person is important to the community.

	The following prompt will help you create a poem, a song, or even a rap that celebrates a person who means a lot to you!
1.	With your class, in a group, or by yourself, make a list of people who are important to you! These people could be teachers, parents, friends, family members, or people in your community who you find really awesome!
2.	Pick one of the people from the above list, and write their name here:
3.	What are the things this person does that make you happy?

4. When you spend time with them, how does this person make you feel?



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5.	How do you think this person makes the world a better, brighter place? What does this person do to help others/make others feel good about themselves?
6.	Now think of positive words you would use to describe them. Make a list of these positive adjectives below:
7.	Use the space below to draw a picture of this person doing one of the things you listed above (in questions 3, 4, and 5) that you think helps your community to be a more peaceful place. If you think you will need more room, feel free to use a separate sheet of paper:



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8. Now that you have written some wonderful things about this person, turn those ideas into a poem, a song, or a rap! Use the space below to write a poem, song, or rap about why you think this person is amazing, and why they mean so much to you! If you need more space, feel free to use the back of this paper!

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When you are finished, share this poem, song, or rap with the person you wrote it about!

If you choose do this activity with your class, try picking a different person in the class each week, until everyone in the class has a poem, song, or rap about how awesome they are!

Looking for more ways to share kind words?

Start a compliment writing campaign in your classroom, at your school, or in your community! Create a complement box, and encourage people to write compliments to each other, then drop them into the box. Then at the end of the week hand them out!

If you're doing it in your class, encourage everyone in the class to write something about each person in the class!

Building a peaceful community is like putting together a puzzle, you must have all the pieces of peace in order for the community to work!

- 2. Put together the peace puzzle!
- 3. For each piece, fill in something that you can do to help encourage each of these qualities in your own life and community. The thing you do can be larger or small.


For example: If you were filling in the trust piece of the puzzle...

Large Action: By creating an honor code for my school

Class Activity

- 1. As a class, pick a project you would like to do!

- 3. Now, think about the talents of all of the people in your class. How can everyone use their talents to make this project a success?

For Example:

- Some people might be good at drawing, and could make flyers telling people about your project
- Some people may be good at writing, and could write an article about your project to put in the school paper or newsletter
- Some people may be good at public speaking, and can tell others about your project
- And much much more!
